



GHHI 29 Hazards



Damp and Mold growth

Caused by dust mites, mold or fungal growth caused by dampness and/or high humidity. It includes threats to mental health and social wellbeing caused by living with damp, damp staining and/or mold growth.

Most vulnerable: 14 years or less



Excess cold

Caused by excessively cold indoor temperatures.



65 years or older



Excess heat

Caused by excessively high indoor air temperatures. Most vulnerable:

65 years or older



Asbestos, Silica and other MMF

Caused by excessive levels of silica, asbestos and man-made mineral fibers (MMF).



Most vulnerable: No Specific Group



Biocides

Threats to health from those chemicals used to treat timber and mold growth in dwelling. While biocides include insecticides and rodenticides to control pest infestations (e.g. cockroaches or rats and mice), these are not considered for the purposes of the HHRT. Most vulnerable: No Specific Group



Carbon monoxide and fuel combustion products

Excess levels of carbon monoxide, nitrogen dioxide, sulphur dioxide and smoke in the dwelling's atmosphere.



Most vulnerable: For CO - 65 years plus; For NO2, SO2 & smoke - no specific group



Lead Ingestion from leadpaint dust, debris or leaded water pipes. Most vulnerable: 6 years or younger

Domestic Hygiene, Pests and Refuse

Covers hazards which can result from poor design, layout and construction such that the dwelling cannot be readily kept clean and hygienic: access into. and harborage within the dwelling for pests; and inadequate and unhygienic provision for storing and disposal of household waste.

Albany Case: "JM" - Michael Lefebvre, CCE

Overview:

"JM" applied to ACAP for Wx September 2016 and ACRHA for home repair grant. CCE Albany completed a Healthy Homes Program visit and referred to Albany County DOH for asthma visit and ACDA for lead assessment & home repair assistance and VA for home & safety repairs.

Leveraged Resources: ~\$66,000

- ACAP Weatherization Assistance Program

 Air seal: penetrations, duct work, basement doors, spray foam rim joist, insulate attic & knee walls, smoke & CO detectors, kitchen fan, refrigerator, shower heads & aerators.
- CCE Albany Healthy Neighborhoods Program & HEAP Conducted assessment, provided education, intervention products (smoke & CO detectors, fire extinguishers, home health & safety products) and air conditioner. Made referrals to ACDOH Asthma Program, Northeastern Association of the Blind & VA Home Repair Health & Safety Program
- ACRHA Senior Rehab Program
 New electrical service, sewer line, dumpster & clutter removal.
- ACDA Lead Base Paint Hazard Control Assistance Encapsulate & paint: stair landing, support column, wall trim; remove & replace: doors, windows & trim, baseboards; wrap window exteriors, HEPA cleaning
- ACDA Homeowner Assistance Program
 Parge foundation, replace: attic window, commode, GFI outlet, switches & light fixtures; sheetrock, smoke & CO detectors.

Rensselaer Case: "PS" - Rich Elder, RC Health Dept.



Overview:

"PS" applied for Wx in 2016. Condition of home did not meet requirements. Referred to Empower for minimal measures and interventions. Referred to City of Rensselaer for home repair grant assistance. Lead inspection June 2017. December 2017 HOME program & Wx coordinated funding -- HNP was done in conjunction. Wx completed April 2018.

Rensselaer Case: "PS" – Rich Elder, RC Health Dept.

<u>Leveraged Resources: ~\$32,000</u>

- CEO Weatherization Assistance Program Weather-seal penetrations & doors, add trim, smoke & CO detectors, cover dirt floor with poly sheeting, repair furnace, replace T-stat & filter, patch holes in walls, sump pump cover.
- CEO NYSERDA EmPower Weather-seal penetrations, front door trim, sheetrock bath ceiling, door sweeps, fix broken window, clean & tune furnace, vent dryer.
- CCE Healthy Neighborhoods Program HEPA vacuum, Smoke & CO detectors, fire extinguishers, home health & safety products, education.
- RC Health Department CLPPP EPA Lead Risk Assessment
- City of Rensselaer Home Repair Grant Replace 4 windows & 8 interior doors, new roof on addition, point 2 chimneys & foundation, remove & build new rear deck, replace railing & stairs, install laminate flooring in 4 rooms, gut & rebuild bathroom, replace sewer line & cleanouts and other repairs.

Overview:

"JP", the homeowner, applied for grant assistance as a result of outreach mailing from BNI. He and his tenant were screened for eligibility and qualified. The grant requires lead testing and an energy audit.


Leveraged Resources: ~\$68,000

- BNI NYS Affordable Housing Corporation
 Smoke/CO detectors, inspect electrical, repair s: basement stairs, kitchen ceiling, roof, foundation; replace: kitchen floor, front porches, missing slate shingles.
- City of Schenectady Lead Safe Housing Program (HUD)
 Replace doors & windows, wrap exterior & paint interior casings & trim, paint peeling & chipping pain on walls, patch & paint concrete walk
- Schenectady County PHS Healthy Neighborhoods Program
 Smoke & CO detectors, fire extinguishers, home health & safety products, education: fire safety, lead poisoning prevention, indoor air quality, asthma triggers, tobacco harms
- AHP NYSERDA EmPower Program 2nd Floor: Insulate exterior walls, refrigerator
- AHP NYSERDA Home Performance Program

 1st Floor: Insulate exterior walls, weather-seal doors, spray foam rim joist, replace electric DHW heater
